How do we Position Children's Rights to Creative and Artistic Pursuits in the EYFS?

Professional Development

Our professional development sessions offer a number of possibilities for reviewing and changing aspects of your provision including:

Pedagogy and Curriculum

All settings have their own approach to play and learning and each plans their curriculum in a different way. The purpose of this session is to explore how you do this, why you do it the way you do and, explore possibilities to develop or change what you currently do.

Observation and Assessment

This session will explore what you currently do, how well this works for you and possibilities for change.
